



PBIS - Parent Letter

Dear Parents,

Worth County High School utilizes the Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (P.B.I.S.) program to help promote a positive environment throughout our entire school district. This program allows us to highlight students who are modeling positive behavior anywhere in the building. With the guidance of this program our P.B.I.S. committee has established a matrix containing rules that students are to model in the classroom, hallways, cafeteria, etc.

The P.B.I.S. program is a schoolwide approach that requires the efforts of administrators, teachers and students. Rules are posted in specific areas throughout the building to help establish an understanding of what is expected of them as they navigate through the school. Faculty members are expected to model appropriate behavior and reinforce the rules of the matrix with students throughout the school day.

In an effort to encourage positivity amongst teachers and students we utilize Ram Bucks that students can use like cash on Fridays in our PBIS store. Students who are modeling the matrix will receive Ram Bucks from teachers and administrators so they can purchase snacks. Playing music on Fridays in the cafeteria is another reward students can receive if rules of the matrix are followed during that week. Students also have the opportunity to participate in our talent show during lunch every 2nd and 4th Friday of the month if they have no office referrals during that two week period in between shows. And finally in an effort to recognize students who are modeling

the matrix on a consistent basis we will be having a 9 week celebration for those students who have a passing average and no office referrals.
