**To help your child meet the district and school goals, the school, you, and your child will work together to:**

### **School/Teacher Responsibilities:**

**Worth County Primary School/Teachers will:**

- Be at work on time every day ready to teach students unless sick or an emergency has occurred
- Provide students with feedback to promote learning, needed support, and confidence in their ability
- Provide a warm, safe, caring learning environment that is conducive to learning
- Teach grade appropriate skills daily and will assign in-school assignments and homework that will help students learn the skills that are taught and that will challenge students
- Send home agendas daily so that an open line of communication is in place between the school and the student's home
- Communicate with parents/guardians concerning their child's academic progress, concerns they may have, and supply needs for their child

- Make sure there are extra school supplies in class in case a student does not have materials that are needed
- Regularly remind students of the school rules and encourage them to be role models by following the rules and listening to directions that are given
- Read to their classes daily and encourage students to spend time reading daily while at school and when they are at home with their parents/guardians
- Send home information about upcoming conferences, events, activities, meetings, and workshops that parents and students can be involved in at Worth County Primary School
- Remind the students to respect the school staff, other students, and school property
- Encourage students to tell their parents what they learned and what they did at school
- Be a role model by making good choices, following the rules, listening, being kind, and helping others

## **Parent/Guardian Responsibilities:**

### **We, as parents/guardians/families, will:**

- Make sure that our child gets to school on time and attends every day unless he/she is sick or an emergency has occurred
- Daily look for agendas/progress reports/report cards so that we can see how our child is progressing with his/her academics, and will communicate with teachers concerning our child's academic progress, concerns we may have, and supplies that our child/child's class may need
- Communicate and emphasize to our child the importance of education and learning
- Make sure that our child has all needed supplies to participate in class and to complete work at home
- Make sure that our child knows and follows the school rules and encourage our child to follow directions that he/she is given by their teachers and school staff
- Read with our child on a daily basis for a minimum time of 20 minutes per day with hopes of encouraging our child to become an active reader
- Participate in activities at school, such as parent-teacher conferences, parent workshops, family learning/fun nights, PTO meetings/events, school decision making, and/or volunteering
- Provide a designated time and quiet place at home for our child to work on homework assignments and study
- Help guide our child with his/her homework and projects when he/she need assistance and will help him/her study each day
- Encourage our child to respect the school staff, students, and school property
- Daily ask our child what they learned at school and what they did at school
- Be a role model by making good choices, following the rules, listening, being kind, and helping others

## **Student Responsibilities:**

### **Worth County Primary School students will:**

- Attend school every day, unless sick, ready to learn and work hard with a good attitude
- Bring their agenda home every day for parents to look at and sign, and bring their book bag, completed homework assignments, and other needed materials to school every day
- Know and follow the school rules, listen to adults who work at the school, and pay attention to the directions given
- Ask for help from teachers, other school staff, and parents when they do not understand
- Complete in-class assignments, complete homework assignments, and study (I can ask my parents to help me study.)
- Ask parents to read to them or help them read every day so that they can be a better reader
- Give parents all papers that the school and teachers send home with them
- Ask my parents to participate in activities at school, such as parent-teacher conferences, parent workshops, family learning/fun nights, PTO meetings/events, school decision making, special breakfasts/events, and/or volunteering

- Respect all school staff, students and school property (books, iPads, Chrome Books) just as they have seen parents and teachers do
- Be a role model by making good choices, following the rules, listening, being kind, and helping others
- Tell my parents everyday about things I learned at school and what I did at school
